ETHEL WATERS 1923 - 1925

n addition to her regular tours on the Keith Theatre Circuit, Ethel Waters also frequently returned to New York for various recording-sessions and live appearances. In the summer of 1924, she replaced Florence Mills at the smart Plantation Club in mid-town Manhattan. During this time, she was offered a residency in Paris as a singer and dancer, an offer she turned down for financial reasons. An almost unknown artist by the name of Josephine Baker accepted the job!

Ethel Waters was born in Chester, Pennsylvania, on October 31, 1896. When still a child, she sang in various church choirs. In 1911, she began working as a maid in Philadelphia, and her singing talents were discovered when she appeared in an amateur contest at a local bar. After several minor engagements in the area, Ethel Waters moved to New York in 1918, soon becoming one of the busiest women in show business. Besides singing, she also took up acting, making her start in the comedy "Hello 1919". In 1921, Ethel Waters was among the first black singers to cut records, several of her early 78s selling extremely well. She toured all over the country with many different acts, but always enjoyed returning to New York for record sessions and stage work. Throughout the twenties and thirties, Ethel Waters was among the most popular stars in black entertainment. In 1930, she made her first European appearances, including performances at the London Palladium. After an incredible success at the Cotton Club with the song "Stormy Weather", Ethel Waters became the first black woman ever to appear in an all-white production on Broadway. Despite her heart-stirring private life, her fame had reached its peak by the close of the thirties. She continued her studio and stage work, but also appeared more frequently in movies. Following several difficult years, she published her acclaimed autobiography. "His Eye Is On The Sparrow", in 1951. Miss Waters continued her career, including several TV productions, until a mild stroke forced her to reduce work in 1964. In her later years, she devoted much time to religious activities. Ethel Waters died on September 1, 1977.

This volume of the complete recordings of Ethel Waters, presented in chronological order, opens with the last two tracks from a session organized by Fletcher Henderson. These extremely rare sides feature Ethel backed by a rather stiff band, although cornetist Elmer Chambers contributes some hot breaks. The next cuts feature Ethel Waters accompanied by Henderson alone. This and the June'23 date rank among her most important sessions of the period, bringing her extended series of recordings for the Black Swan label to a worthy conclusion. Accompanied by her regular planist Pearl Wright, plus Joe Smith, Ethel next cut two very fine sides, Smith's beautifully subtle cornet solo on "Tell 'Em 'Bout Me" proving particularly impressive. Lovie Austin, primarily remembered for her excellent recordings with musicians from Chicago's South Side (see Classics 756), accompanies Ethel on the next date. The powerful cornetist is most probably Tommy Ladnier, who often worked with Lovie Austin at this time. In April and May 1925, Ms. Waters recorded in New York, again with musicians from the Fletcher Henderson band. Although there are no instrumental solos, it seems that Don Redman was present on both dates. This CD ends with another set with backing from Pearl Wright, plus Horace Holmes, a cornetist who had previously worked with Manie Smith. To be continued...
